**EXECUTIVE ORDER IN RESPONSE TO COVID-19
(COVID-19 EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 7)**

WHEREAS, on January 27, 2020, the United States Secretary of Health and Human Services declared that the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (“COVID-19” or the “Virus”) is a public health emergency of international concern; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States declared a national emergency beginning March 1, 2020, in an effort to contain and mitigate the national impact of the expanding global outbreak of the Virus and has activated emergency plans for the protection of our citizens; and

WHEREAS, JB Pritzker, Governor of Illinois, declared all counties in the State of Illinois as a disaster area on March 9, 2020 (Gubernatorial Disaster Proclamation) in response to the outbreak of COVID-19 and again declared all counties in the State of Illinois as a disaster area on April 1, 2020, April 30, 2020 and May 29, 2020 (the Second, Third and Fourth Gubernatorial Disaster Proclamations, and, together with the First Gubernatorial Disaster Proclamation, the Gubernatorial Disaster Proclamations) in response to the exponential spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, I proclaimed a Disaster in the Village of Glendale Heights on March 17, 2020 and Declared an Emergency on March 23, 2020 pursuant to Village Ordinance 2020-14 in response to the COVID-19 outbreak; and

WHEREAS, JB Pritzker, Governor of Illinois, has issued Gubernatorial Executive Order Number 2020-39, extending the provisions of 2020-03, 2020-04, 2020-05, 2020-06, 2020-07, 2020-08, 2020-09, 2020-11, 2020-12, 2020-13, 2020-14, 2020-15, 2020-16, 2020-17, 2020-20, 2020-21, 2020-22, 2020-23, 2020-24, 2020-25, 2020-26, 2020-27, 2020-28, 2020-29, 2020-30, 2020-31, 2020-34, 2020-35, 2020-36, and 2020-37; and

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has established a plan to reopen the Illinois economy in phases entitled the “Restore Illinois Plan”; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 has resulted in significant economic impact, including loss of income for businesses and wages for individuals and families, that undermine financial security and stability; and

WHEREAS, the Governor’s “Stay at Home” orders which ended May 28, and “Restore Illinois Plan” in regards to the COVID-19 pandemic has interrupted the transportation and supply chain for businesses throughout the community; and

WHEREAS, the “Stay at Home” order and “Restore Illinois Plan” effectively closed most sit-down liquor establishments and bars for an extended period of time; and

WHEREAS, the inability of restaurants to allow dine-in eating has severely impacted their ability to attract customers to their ability to carry-out or have curbside delivery; and

WHEREAS, the State has moved to Phase 3 of the Governor’s “Restore Illinois Plan” which allows Restaurants and Bars to serve patrons outdoors under certain parameters set by the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for all previously issued Village of Glendale Heights Executive Orders as they pertain to COVID-19 outbreak response, Numbers 2020-1, 2020-2, 2020-3, 2020-4, 2020-5 and 2020-6, to be restated, reissued and extended.

THEREFORE, by the powers vested in me as the Village President of the Village of Glendale Heights, Illinois, and pursuant to the Illinois Management Agency Act 20 ILCS 3305, and the Village of Glendale Heights Ordinance No. 2020-14, Ordinance No. 2020-22, Ordinance No. 2020-30 and Ordinance No. 2020-38, I hereby order the following, effective May 29, 2020, and for the remainder of the duration of the Gubernatorial Disaster Proclamation and Executive Orders, Phase 3 of the “Restore Illinois Plan” and beyond as indicated in each section as it pertains to expiration dates and deadlines:

Section 1: All previously issued Village of Glendale Heights Executive Orders (Numbers 2020-1, 2020-2, 2020-3, 2020-4, 2020-5 and 2020-6) as they pertain to the COVID-19 outbreak response within the Village of Glendale Heights shall remain in full force and effect through June 28, 2020.

Section 2: Section 11-6-10A1 of the Municipal Code of the Village of Glendale Heights as it pertains to the permit requirements for temporary signs and number of days a temporary sign can be displayed is hereby suspended until such time as restaurants and bars are allowed to offer a dine-in option for their patrons.

Section 3: Section 4-3-34 of the Municipal Ordinances of the Village shall be suspended relating to the cessation of business for an establishment holding a liquor license that has been closed for more than thirty (30) successive days and shall not result in a forfeiture of said license.

Section 4: Section 5-6-5C of the Municipal Code of the Village of Glendale Heights as it pertains to Loading and Unloading during specific hours is hereby suspended for the duration of this Emergency.

Section 5: The issuance of parking tickets for parking during street maintenance section 7-8-3D1, D2, D3 and D4 of the Municipal Code of the Village of Glendale Heights is hereby suspended through May 31, 2020.

Section 6: The deadline for the application of the Senior Citizen Utility Tax rebate is hereby extended from April 30 to June 30, 2020.

Section 7: The following citations will be suspended through May 30, 2020; Title 7, Chapter 2 7-2-2(A-1) Village Vehicle License Required; Title 7, Chapter 2, 7-2-6- Failure to display Village vehicle sticker or improper display of Village sticker; Chapter 7, Chapter 7, 7-7-9(E) overnight parking on street from 2:00AM to 6:00 AM without display of Village sticker prohibited; Title 6, Chapter 5, 6-5A-1(A) Dog and Cat license required.

Section 8: Village programming and events shall be scheduled following the guidelines established in the “Restore Illinois Plan” and by the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity. Glendale Lakes Golf Course shall open pursuant to the rules set forth by the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity.

Section 9: Local Food and Beverage sales tax for the months of March, April and May are deferred without penalty. Any taxpayers taking advantage of this relief will be required to pay their Local Food and Beverage tax liabilities due in March, April and May in four installments starting on June 20, 2020 and extending through September 20, 2020.

Section 10: Effective March 23, 2020 and continuing through June 30, 2020 all water shutoffs for non-payment of water bills will be suspended. Late fees on the March water bill due April 6, the April water bill due May 5 and the May water bill due June 4, 2020 will be waived.

Section 11: Door to door solicitation within Village limits is prohibited through June 30, 2020.

Section 12: Late fees on parking tickets issued in March, April and May are waived.

Section 13: The expiration date on 2019/2020 village vehicle stickers, set to expire on June 30, 2020, is hereby extended until July 31, 2020.

Section 14: The water rate increase scheduled by ordinance to take effect on May 1, 2020 is postponed until July 1, 2020 at which time it will take effect as provided by ordinance.

Section 15: Village Hall Hours as set forth in Section 1-5-4 of the Village Ordinance as they relate to Saturday hours in June are amended to Saturday hours being in July.

Section 16: The requirement set forth in sections 11-10B-3, 11-10C-3 and 11-10D-3, requiring a conditional use permit for an establishment serving alcohol outdoors is waived for existing establishments while in Phase 3 of the “Restore Illinois Plan”. Establishments must request permission from the Community Development Department on the forms and in the manner as set by the Department.


Section 17: The requirement set forth in section 11-4-12C11 of Village Ordinance regarding the requirement for a Temporary Land Use permit for outdoor dining establishments is hereby waived while in Phase 3 of the “Restore Illinois Plan”. Permit fees for temporary use of land as set forth in section 10-1-8-1 are waived. Establishments must request permission from the Community Development Department on the forms and in the manner as set by the Department.

Section 18: Parking lot requirements as set forth in section 11-5-7-1 are waived for existing restaurants and bars that are temporarily establishing outdoors serving areas while in Phase 3 of the “Restore Illinois Plan”.

Section 19: Closing time for all restaurants and bars with outdoor service areas shall be 11:00 PM Sundays through Thursdays and Midnight on Fridays and Saturdays. Opening times shall remain as currently in place.

Section 20: Permit fees for tents and canopies as set forth in section 10-1-8-1 of the Village Ordinances is hereby waived while in Phase 3 of the “Restore Illinois Plan”. Establishments must request permission from the Community Development Department on the forms and in the manner as set by the Department.

Section 21: If any provision of the Executive Order or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, this invalidity does not affect any other provision or application of this Executive Order, which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application. To achieve this purpose, the provisions of this Executive Order are declared to be severable.
