
Coffee with the Mayor & Board

Winter Prep on Your Vehicle

It is always a good idea to perform some form of Winter preparation on your personal vehicles. The Village's Fleets Division recommends doing the following before the cold season arrives:

- Consider having your engine oil and filter changed and vital fluids checked. Good maintenance should include changing other fluids on your vehicle as well. A good recommendation is to have the transmission oil changed every 50,000 miles along with the filter.
- Make sure you have a winter blend of windshield washer fluid that
 will not freeze in cold weather. Keep a bottle of windshield washer fluid
 in the trunk as well. With winter weather, you will consume
 more washer fluid.
- With colder weather, the electrical system will be less efficient. Have your battery and charging system inspected.
- Hope for the best and prepare for the worst. Be sure to have good winter wiper blades properly installed. Even the best prepared vehicles can break down and being prepared will keep you warm and safe until help arrives.

Village Engineering Update

This year, two major road projects were undertaken and should be completed in October. The 2015 Motor Fuel Tax (MFT) Road Program encompasses road repair in the Village on Marilyn Ave and Altgeld Ave. Sidewalks, curbs and driveway aprons in need of repair were removed and replaced, and all damaged pavement on the roads was replaced.

The other major road work was a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) project, which uses in part, grant money administered by DuPage County. The road project involved the repaving of Darlene Lane and Pleasant Avenue, total replacement of the curb, and the removal and replacement of driveway aprons and sidewalks in need of repair. The watermain underneath these roads was also replaced, which should reduce future watermain breaks and keep water service uninterrupted. As part of this project, Lynn Court will also have new street lighting.

Staff also upheld all local state and federal mandates, including storm water management compliance to new construction sites and ensured projects complied with Village Code.

Fire Hydrant Flushing

The Utilities Division will begin their fire hydrant flushing program in October. Customarily this has been undertaken in the spring and early summer months. Flushing in the fall season reduces the peak daily flows as the summer months demand higher volumes of water use due to lawn irrigation and other outdoor activities.

The Utilities Division is dedicated to providing the highest quality potable water as well as conserving this precious natural resource. The annual flushing of the water distribution system may remove stagnant water that is trapped within the water distribution system at various locations such as dead ends, cul-de-sacs and areas of the Village that do not have a high water usage. In addition to flushing the fire hydrants, Utilities staff also perform a thorough inspection of each fire hydrant. Any operations or maintenance issues noted are logged in a data base and corrected in a timely manner. This annual maintenance program ensures proper operating fire hydrants in times of emergencies.

In-House Street Sweeping

The In-House Street Sweeping program begins on a weekly basis for all Sweeping Zones starting Friday, October 2nd through the month of November, weather permitting. The Village street sweeper will be aided by supplemental contracted sweepers to complete all zones each week.

There are color coded "No-Parking" signs erected in each zone to indicate the day that the parking restrictions are in effect. Please remove all vehicles from the roadway on the Sweeping Zones designated day of the week between the hours of 8:00 am and 4:00 pm. This will aid the Village in efficiently street sweeping each of the zones. For more information on the Street Sweeping program, please visit www.glendaleheights.org.

Speed Traffic Trailer Requests

If you live in Glendale Heights and feel that you have a problem with speeding vehicles in your neighborhood, you are encouraged to request the trailer to be scheduled in your area by calling Sergeant Michael Skopek at 630.260.6070.

If you are a resident of Glendale Heights, you have probably seen the interesting device the Police Department uses to assist in combating speeding vehicles and to remind drivers to watch their speed. The trailer helps promote speed limit compliance in neighborhoods, school zones, construction sites and dangerous areas.

The trailer is a portable, self-contained speed display unit. It is left on the roadway to display speeds of oncoming vehicles on a highly visible LED display. A speed limit sign mounted on the unit reminds drivers what the actual speed limit is on the roadway that they are on. The unit also has the capability of recording the speeds of the vehicles for traffic studies.

October is Anti-Bullying Awareness Month

Bullying is unwanted, aggressive behavior among school aged children that involves a real or perceived power imbalance. The behavior is repeated, or has the potential to be repeated, over time. Bullying includes actions such as making threats, spreading rumors, attacking someone physically or verbally, and excluding someone from a group on purpose.



Bullying is the most common form of violence in schools (verbally and physically) with one incident of bullying happening every seven minutes. It is estimated that 160,000 children miss school everyday due to the fear of attack or intimidation by other students. Two out of three teens are verbally or physically harassed every year. Studies have shown that 58% of teens have had hurtful things said to them in person or online and over 40% say it's happened more than once.

Bullying can affect everyone—those who are bullied, those who bully, and those who witness bullying. Bullying is linked to many negative outcomes including impacts on mental health, substance use, and suicide. It is important to talk to kids to determine whether bullying—or something else—is a concern.

Remember that school is back in session. It is critical that we remain extra cautious and alert for children while driving through the community. This is also a perfect opportunity to review safety awareness with your children.

DRIVERS:

SLOW DOWN!!! Be **EXTRA ALERT** around parked cars, school crossings, anywhere children are present. USE CAUTION near bus stops. It is unlawful for a driver to pass a school bus that has stopped to load or unload children when its stop signal arm is extended. The driver is required to stop his or her vehicle before passing the school bus from either direction. An exception is when the driver is on a highway with four or more lanes with at least two lanes of traffic in either direction. If the driver is going in the opposite direction of the bus, they do not have to stop.

PARENTS:

Know your child's route to and from school, who they walk with and where they live. Review pedestrian rules and the importance of wearing a helmet when biking or skating with your children. Discuss "home alone" rules, what to do in an emergency and "stranger danger" in an age appropriate manner to ALL age groups! Cross streets where Crossing Guards are present when possible.

STUDENTS:

Keep your regular routes to and from school, never walk alone, and always follow traffic signals and crossing guards. Always use crosswalks, never walk between cars, and ALWAYS wear a helmet when biking or skating. Follow your parents "home alone" and after-school rules, know what to do in an emergency, and remember "stranger danger" guidelines apply to ALL AGES!

Energy Efficient Lighting at WPCF

The Village of Glendale Heights recently completed a lighting upgrade project at the Water Pollution Control Facility (WPCF). Dog & Cat Licensing

The Village of Glendale Heights by Ordinance requires that the owner of any dog or cat above the age of six months, kept or housed within the Village to be licensed and wearing the license/ tag at all times.

The biggest benefit of registering your pet with the Village of Glendale Heights is the increased chance of being reunited with your dog or cat, should it become lost. Applying for the license



also serves as a reminder to renew your pet's annual rabies vaccination, which could save the pet's life.

The application must be made through the

Administrative Services counter of the Village Hall (300 Civic Center Plaza), after the dog or cat turns six months old. The license is valid for one year from the issue date of the license. Annually, a new tag must be obtained with proof of your animal receiving its current rabies tag.

Required for License Application

- A Completed Application is available on the Village Website at www.glendaleheights.org/ AdminServices/animal_licenses.html and at the Administrative Services counter of Village Hall.
- Proof of Current Rabies Vaccination/Inoculation (capable of preventing Rabies for immunization periods of either one or three years) from a Registered Veterinarian.
- Fee of \$5.00

Glenside Fire Protection District has created a memorial in its lobby to honor those who lost their lives during the terrorist attacks of September 11th. The memorial being displayed by the Glenside Fire District is a tribute to the remembrance of the dedicated and courageous individuals who lost their lives on that fateful September 11th morning, including 343 firefighters and EMS personnel, 72 law enforcement officers and 2,996 civilians. Included in the display are artifacts from all three attack sites – a piece of steel from the World Trade Center, debris from the crash site in Pennsylvania and a piece of limestone from the Pentagon building. Glenside Fire Chief Russell Wood said "we don't want to forget that day or the impact it had on our country...it was the worst day in our firefighter history...343 firefighters lost their lives."

The display is a permanent staple at the Glenside Fire Protection District Station for the pub-

lic to view during business hours of 8:00 am – 4:30 pm, Mondays through Fridays. Let us never forget!



A Great Credit Check Up!

The Village recently completed a credit rating update from Moody's Investors Services. Moody's affirmed that they judged the Village to be of the highest quality, with minimal credit risk. In fact, after the Village issued bonds in 2010 for capital projects, Moody's completed an internal re-rating of the Village and deemed it to be Aa2, an even better score than a previous rating of Aa3. On July 10, 2015, the official Moody's report affirmed that this upgrade was justified. Moody's commended the Village Board and executive management team for maintaining a strong financial position and having implemented sound policies and practices. The Moody's report indicates that their decision to keep the Village at the higher Aa2 reflects its ample reserve position, stable operations, and strong management team with long-term fiscal and capital planning practices.
