Structure Fire, Death Investigation (Update)

On Monday, August 24 at approximately 10:02 AM, the Glendale Heights Police Department was summoned to the 100 block of Dunteman in the Waters Edge Condominiums complex. Upon arrival, responding officers witnessed a fire in a residential condominium building. Bloomingdale Fire Department responded along with several surrounding fire departments and extinguished the fire.

Two subjects are reported as deceased. Their cause of death is unknown at this time. The names of the deceased individuals are not being released at this time pending identification by the DuPage County Coroner's Office.

One juvenile was injured and transported to an area hospital where he was treated and released.

Four police officers and four fire fighters were transported to area hospitals due to injuries received during this incident. All of the injured first responders were treated and released.

Six condominium units were damaged and accommodations were secured for displaced residents by Glendale Heights Police Department Community Outreach Specialists and American Red Cross. Continued assistance to displaced residents is being provided by the Village of Glendale Heights and the Glendale Heights Police Department.

The cause of the fire is unknown.

This incident remains under investigation by Glendale Heights Police Department investigators, Bloomingdale Fire Department investigators, the DuPage County Fire Investigation Task Force and the DuPage County State's Attorney's Office. Additional details will be shared when available.
